Hi All;


I have very few words for this month's newsletter because I have had similar computer problems to Graham's. Mine also crashed and has been in the shop for some time now.

Shopsmith informed its shareholders that it has given Plan B Associates day to day decision-making power and a year to improve the company's performance.

In 2005/06 Shopsmith had sales of \$11.1 million but with a loss of \$649,000. These sales were 20% less than those of the previous fiscal year.

Chief Financial Officer Mark A. May declined to comment on what their plans are to make a turnaround.

Shopsmith's primary product is the Mark V woodworking machine and the peripheral tools for it.
