Minutes




Food was on the agenda last month. Those members in attendance brought all sorts of goodies to the last meeting of the year.

A WOOD WORD

A few weeks ago I dropped in to Halifax Specialty Hardwoods and picked up several pieces of Aspen and thought that I should caution all of you based upon my experience with the species. I had to change the thickness of the pieces and found that you must plane Aspen with the grain. A lot of feathering and roughness will occur if you don't. You should also repeatedly check your dust collector hoses or planer vacuum port. Aspen makes a lot of fluffy sawdust and clogs easily.

Ripping Aspen caused problems as well. Aspen does not produce very wide boards so therefore you will probably be ripping through the heartwood.

LIBRARY

Jen, Cecil and other members have done a singular job of not just moving the tons of library books, magazines and tapes to our new home but they have spent hours on cataloguing them. There are two large metal cabinets full to the brim (almost) for members to peruse and borrow.

But, there is a catch. In order to borrow any books you must be a <u>fully paid up member</u>. That is a paid member with a 2007 membership card.

Members may borrow a maximum of three (3) books or five (5) magazines at a time and they may borrow them for one month, or until the next scheduled monthly general meeting.

Drilling and screwing are also problematical. make certain that your drill bits are very sharp otherwise you will experience a lot of tear-out. Pre-drill your holes as it seems Aspen will split quite easily.
