The AWA Library database is now online!

The database features a visual listing of all our books and DVD's with covers and descriptions. Presently we have 355 items in the database!

Log in to the AWA website and click the 'Library' link on the menu bar to access.

Note that the online listing is ordered by category and then title. The categories are:

Boatbuilding, Cabinetmaking, Design, DVD, Furnituremaking, Home Building, Miscellaneous, Projects, Reference, Tools, Toys, Woodcarving, Woodturning

Unfortunately, because of software limitations the categories are not clearly marked but by looking at the titles you can get a pretty good idea which category you are looking at.

Also note that not all book covers and descriptions are available, particularly for our older books. This is an ongoing process. If you would like to help please email me any cover images and descriptions for ones that are missing. Thanks.

Working in tandem with the new Coloured Tape Categorization (CTC) system I believe that the online database will be a great tool for planning in advance of a meeting which books or DVDs you would like to borrow and then easily find them when you get to the meeting. Enjoy! :)

And speaking of the Coloured Tape Categorization (CTC) system, it is working well and it is proving to be a lot easier in finding books in a certain category. It is particularly helpful in returning books to their respective category as well.
