

Dear AWA Scroll-Sawyers,

I have enjoyed working on the beet-juice-stained memory books (thanks for coining that term, Graham!) which have served as excellent wedding gifts. During the next couple of months, I may "outsource" as piecework the following, each week, to a more experienced scroll-sawyer who also has a drill press: (a) scroll-sawing two curvaceous covers out of two, 3/4", square-foot, pine boards provided; (b) drill-pressing four, 10mm- or 12-mm-diameter holes into the same thickness of pine. I.e., under an hour's work, weekly.

for processing into bark mulch, and John told us that he will select good logs and saw them into hardwood lumber. Good quality, but not dried.

I needed a dozen or so red oak boards, 5/4" x 8" x 8', and Jim Verboom was able to supply them at a very good price. I had to wait for the right logs to appear; Jim told me he sees lots of ash, maple and yellow birch, but not so much oak. He also usually has wide pine boards in stock. My next challenge is to dry the wood.
