Brian Robinson has some plywood bargains for AWA members. These are Baltic Birch Plywood ends and all are 5/8" thick. The pieces have never been used and are BBB or better, veneer plywood. Brian says that full size sheets retail for about \$45 and it is an ideal product for shelving, drawers, jigs, fixtures and other small projects. Here is what Brian has:

- 1.) 5/8" (15mm) Baltic Birch Plywood, 19" x 60" \$8.00 per sheet.
- 2.) -5/8" (15mm) Baltic Birch Plywood, 17 ½" x 40 ½" \$6.00 per sheet. Brian says that you can expect a lower price on quantities of 20 sheets or more.
