Hands-On Halifax is Halifax's only community woodworking shop. We're a place where beginner woodworkers can take classes, practice with tools and ask questions, and this would not be possible without the generosity of experienced woodworkers to help guide them.

On Monday nights from 6pm-9pm we have a bydonation drop-in with skilled volunteers on site to help people with their woodworking projects and teach basic skills. We also offer more structured classes, where an experienced woodworker will pick a project (say, making a wine rack or a set of chopsticks) and teach that project to a few participants. In these cases, the instructor has lots of flexibility about what kind of project they want to teach, when the class is held, and how much they wish to charge (the instructor gets 50% of the registration fee too!). Hands-On Halifax then does the work of promoting the class, registering students and providing the space and tools. The shop's open hours are determined by volunteer numbers too. We were able to add the Monday night drop-in night because Tuesday and Thursday nights are staffed by regular volunteers. Adding more opening hours, especially daytime hours, is our next goal, and will only be possible with skilled volunteers staffing the space.
